Facility Overview

Lismore Base Hospital (LBH) is the recognised Trauma
Centre for the North Coast
Region and is linked to the local
helicopter retrieval service. The
hospital is an acute referral
hospital of 280 beds, serving
a population of approximately
170,000 people on the Far North
Coast of NSW and has a busy
Emergency Department (41,000
presentations annually & 55
beds/treatment spaces), 12 bed
ICU and a 6 bed Coronary Care
Unit.

A wide range of medical and surgical specialties and subspecialties are provided, as well as the majority of speciality services. LBH plays an important role in providing high level specialist services on a regional level. This includes access to formalised Retrieval Service over a 300km radius and a regional Trauma service. We also have specialist emergency and elective surgical services including Vascular, Upper GI, Urology, Orthopaedics, ENT and

FACS Max. There is a Cardiac Cath Lab, Hybrid operating theatre, a full suite of radiology services including PET scanner and a comprehensive cancer treatment and radiation therapy centre. LBH has recently opened a refurbished medical ward with stroke, acute delirium beds and general medical beds with a gym and activities of daily life kitchen.

After a recent \$312 million renovation, the new health facilities allow for contemporary models of care that clinicians and staff are excited to deliver in their local community.

This major redevelopment has brought the health campus up to the highest standard and ensures patients can continue to access the health care they need close to home.

The co-location of the community health services on the hospital campus enables staff to provide greater continuity of care and better support patients as they move from acute hospital care back into the community.



Local Area



LBH is an affiliated teaching hospital for medical students from the University of Sydney, University of Wollongong, University of Western Sydney, University of Newcastle, Bond University, University of Queensland and Griffith University. The hospital has a strong commitment to teaching and support for its JMOs.

LBH has rosters based on the JMO term dates. These are administered by the JMO Manager in conjunction with the department directors in each discipline. Junior Medical Officers participate in the after hours and on-call rosters in a well supported environment, including buddying during intern orientation for after hours shifts.

Junior Medical Officers have access to the Wagner Suite Doctor's Lounge with offices, quiet study areas, computers, WI-FI, Videoconferencing and recreational facilities in their own private space on Level 8. A Block.
