Local Area

Liverpool Hospital is located approximately 35 minutes' drive from the Sydney CBD. It began as a tent hospital for convicts and soldiers 200 years ago and now provides a health service of international standing, with 23 operating theatres, capacity for 877 beds, diagnostic and imaging services, emergency and trauma care, maternity, paediatric, cancer care, mental health, ambulatory care, allied health and medical and surgical services from birth to aged care.

The Hospital is the major health service for south-western Sydney, providing services to the local government area of Liverpool City Council as well as district services to residents and visitors in the area. It also provides a range of statewide services in areas such as critical care and trauma, neonatal intensive care and brain injury rehabilitation.

Liverpool City and south-western Sydney is home to people from diverse cultures, religious and languages, making our community vibrant and exciting. We are situated in one of the fastest-growing regions in Australia and sit within an education and health precinct which includes the <u>Ingham Institute of Applied Medical Research</u>, a <u>Clinical Skills and Simulation Centre</u>, the <u>Clinical Schools</u> of the University of NSW and University of Western Sydney, <u>South West Private Hospital</u> and <u>South Western Sydney TAFE</u>.

At Liverpool Hospital we run the now well established, unique JETS model for afterhours cover. This is Team based care and involves a group of 15 JMOs who cover the afterhours shifts from 1430 – 2230, Mon-Fri. These JMOs cover their own teams during these shifts and they are done in 2 week blocks with the JMO rotating back into their home team day shifts after 2 weeks.
