

WSLHD Overview

- Encompasses three Local Government Areas and 120 suburbs.
- > 780 km2 with estimated population of 846,389
- Second largest population in NSW, projected to increase to nearly 1.3 million by 2031
- Includes Westmead, Auburn, Blacktown, Mount Druitt and Cumberland Hospitals
- > 1.5 % of our population self identify as being Aboriginal
- A total of 48% of residents speak a language other than English at home
- Our community faces some increasing health trends. These include childhood obesity, diabetes, rising mental health issues and conditions related to aging.
- We face a rising demand for health services and increasingly complex chronic conditions
- Employ 11,855 people across more than 100 sites including five hospitals and network of community health centres



Blacktown Local Government Area

Blacktown population will grow by **36%** by 2030 from **326, 907** in 2015 to **445, 415**.



2.8% of residents in 2016 identified as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander.



39% of residents were born overseas.




Blacktown Ranked First for access by public transport

Challenges and Opportunities

- Blacktown is transforming from a District hospital to a University Teaching hospital, incorporating the WSU Clinical School, Research and Education Centre
- Establishment of academic medical units to increase research and teaching profile of the hospital.
- Compounding 10% p.a. activity growth with total BMDH ED presentations > 90,000
- Opportunities with the changing clinical care process and practices with the one hospital
 -two
 campus model.
- Redeveloping inpatient services to new models of care to include Rapid Access Clinics
- New state of the art facilities
- Increasing complexity of existing services and establishment of new clinical services
- Attracting and growing the healthcare workforce.

- Network of Clinical Services Westmead, Auburn, Blacktown, Mount Druitt, Cumberland and Integrated and Community Health
- Blacktown and Mount Druitt hospitals operating under one management team
- Located 11 kilometres apart servicing the Blacktown and Mount Druitt LGA's.
- Blacktown is a Major Hospital (Level B1) transiting to a Principal Referral Hospital (A)
- Mount Druitt is a District Hospital (Level C1)
- Clinical services are networked across the two campuses with 500 beds
