

The forum is a face-to-face event only to support peer networking and participation. Limited support for travel and accommodation is available via an Expression of Interest (EOI).



Forum focus

The forum will provide members an opportunity to connect and reflect through a culturally informed process, Dadirri (inner deep listening and quiet still awareness). Through participating in an Aboriginal mindfulness and wellbeing immersion workshop, you will have the opportunity to develop a deeper understanding of yourself, your relationships, and interactions with others and how this can be applied to building effective relationships, both personally and professionally.

An enriching cultural art activity will be facilitated by Jason from Dalmarri, including connection to Country, local histories, storytelling, and the power of Aboriginal art.

The forum held at the Kirribilli Club on the land of Cammeraygal people of the Eora nation. Offering a versatile space to network, participate in enriching cultural activities and build connection with allied health peers.

Aboriginal wellbeing facilitators will be onsite throughout the day to provide culturally safe personal support.


About the venue

The Kirribilli Club offers spectacular views over North Sydney and has a parkland area across road. Depending on weather, this may be used as outdoor space on the day.

How to get to the venue

The facility is situated in a central location at North Sydney. The following transport options are available:

- Car Parking available for patrons (\$24) there is limited street parking
- Public transport close to Milsons Point train station (7 mins walk)
- Flights for participants who are travelling longer distances to the event location, transportation will be made available from Sydney accommodation (located near the Airport).







Travel and Accommodation support

Travel support is limited. To be eligible for travel support, attendees must reside/work more than 1.5 hours from the event location. EOIs will be considered on a case-by-case basis in relation to allocated funding and is at the discretion of HETI. Consideration will also be given to the number of EOIs received from each organisation and, where necessary, the organisation's Director of Allied Health or the Ministry of Health will be consulted. Successful applicants will be supported with travel support needs.

For this forum, examples of travel support could include overnight accommodation if driving longer distances from outside the Sydney metropolitan areas, or flights and accommodation and shared transfers if traveling from rural and regional NSW. HETI will book all travel arrangements.

You will need to:

- Gain approval from your manager to undertake travel and attendance
- Complete an EOI Travel Application Form.
