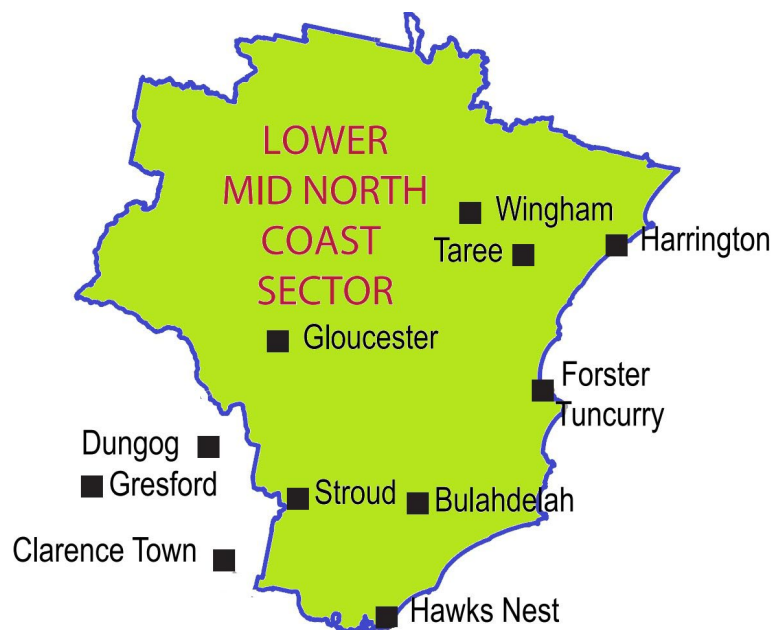


ABOUT US

FAQS



Q: Will I be required to work night shifts as an intern?

A: During your Intern year you will have around a week of night shifts in your Emergency ED term. All other terms are day shift.



Q: Will I be paid for overtime?

A: Un-rostered overtime is paid upon validation of the overtime claim via Medical Admin. Rostered overtime is offered from time to time and will be paid to you within the same pay period it is offered.



Q: How about accommodation?
