

Overview of Facilities

Kempsey District Hospital

The Kempsey District Hospital is a 81 bed level 3 facility with a level 4 Emergency department.

The Kempsey District Hospital provides a 24 hour Emergency Department (ED) and a range of specialist services including, close observation unit, general medicine, surgical day procedures, obstetrics, drug and alcohol, mental health, renal dialysis and rehabilitation.

Additional services include physiotherapy, dietetics, social work, pharmacy, occupational therapy and Aboriginal health. Diagnostic services include onsite Pathology, CT Scans, Ultrasound and General X-Ray.

Wauchope District Memorial Hospital

Wauchope District Memorial Hospital provides a seven day per week Urgent Care Centre service between the hours of 8am and 6pm, and a range of specialist services, including day only surgery, palliative care, and rehabilitation.

Additional services include physiotherapy, occupational therapy, social work, pharmacy, and dietetics. Diagnostic services include Pathology and general X-Ray. The Wauchope Health Campus consists of Wauchope District Memorial Hospital and Wauchope Community Health Centre. Wauchope Hospital provides a 24-hour, level 3 service.

Will there be support for planning my career? Heaps!!! We have supportive mentors, careers sessions & tips to prepare for recruitment


Will I be rostered weekends? Yes approx. 2-3 per term, you can swap weekends with other **JMOs**
