This is the first newsletter in a series from HETI to support training providers with the implementation of the new National Framework for Prevocational Medical Training. The National Framework will be implemented across NSW training providers from 2024 (with the exception of the ePortfolio and EPAs which will be implemented from 2025).

The National Framework provides a consistent and standardised approach to the training and assessment of prevocational medical trainees across Australia. The National Framework will ensure that all trainees receive a high standard of training and support and will be a valuable tool for guiding your hospital's prevocational training program.

What is happening in NSW

DPET and JMO Manager Forum

HETI held a DPET and JMO Manager Forum on 21 March. The forum was well attended by DPETS and JMO Managers across the state. The workshops held during the forum focused on preparing for training providers mapping accredited terms to the new term classification requirements (see focus for April / May) as well as the supervisor training requirements of the National Framework. More workshops will be scheduled throughout 2023 to continue to support training providers through to implementation.



Focus for April / May - Mapping of Terms

All training providers are required to assign one, with a maximum of two new term classifications to each of their existing provisional and accredited training terms. This is an important step in preparing for the implementation of the National Framework.

Training providers have received correspondence from the Chair of the NSW Prevocational Accreditation Committee (PAC) outlining the action required. This also included the term mapping factsheet and mapping template for this activity.

Information submitted by prevocational training providers will be reviewed by the PAC before being migrated by HETI staff into the Prevocational Medical Accreditation Program (PMAP).





To continue to support training providers in NSW, several term mapping drop-in sessions will be hosted on MS Teams.

Q: When can training providers expect the term mapping preparation activity correspondence and supporting documents?

The Chair of the Prevocational Accreditation Committee (PAC) will be writing to training providers in the coming weeks with the request to complete this preparation activity along with supporting template and guide.

Q: When will the new assessment forms be implemented?

The new assessment forms will be implemented at the commencement of the 2024 clinical year. For the 2023 clinical year training providers are to continue using the existing term assessment forms. Further information about the new forms will be provided later in the year.

Q: The National Framework references Director of Clinical Training (DCT), will NSW continue to use the title Director of Prevocational Education and Training (DPET)?

Yes, NSW will continue to use the title of Director of Prevocational Education and Training (DPET).
