Affiliated with the University of Wollongong, Graduate School of Medicine, Wollongong Hospital and Shoalhaven District Memorial Hospital provides teaching and research opportunities with Professors in various fields of medicine. Wollongong Hospital has 500 inpatient beds and most of the main specialties, with specialists and registrars who are keen to help interns and residents get onto their preferred training scheme. Rosters/Teaching/mentoring etc

Rosters are provided at least two weeks prior to the commencement of term, and you will have an opportunity to put in your requests for each roster. Regular feedback on rosters is sought from the RMOA.

Term Allocations are completed based on your preferences and the process of allocations is a fair and transparent process. Your interests and future career pathway requirements are taken into consideration.

We have a great teaching culture in ISLHD. There is a formal education program which is protected for both PGY1s and PGY2s. Different innovative ways of teaching have been developed to improve engagement and learning.

This includes the following:

- Interactive Simulation sessions/interactive workshops and Clinical Skills/ Procedures with specialised educational content as well as Case based discussions with a focus on prioritising decision-making skills.
- Transition to Registrar program with half day later in the year dedicated to specific career pathways- e.g. GP training day, Surgical skills day.
- Career Development Workshops including CV Writing Skills and Career Information Night.
- There is also a draft framework for coordinated delivery of formal education across the network to bring consistency and improvements to education at all our sites.
- Several wellbeing initiatives have been taken to resource JMOs with strategies to support JMO well-being as well as peers experiencing deteriorating wellbeing.
- Several workshops and information sessions planned, catering to the personal and professional development of junior doctors.

Although there is no formal mentoring process, the medical workforce unit, DPET and RMOA work collaboratively to support all the JMOs in transitioning into training especially those who are new to the network.
